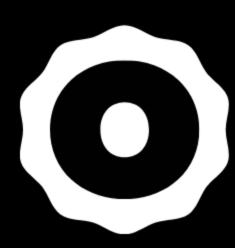
G.O.A.L.S. FOR STUDENT PARTICIPATION



GET TO KNOW THE STUDENT

- Observe the student in all settings
- Use tools to assess the student
- Identify the student's strengths and needs
- Build an interpersonal connection
- Consider the student's school environment



ORGANIZE THE TEAM

- Identify members of the educational team
- Acknowledge each team member's knowledge and experience
- Establish good communication and trust
- Develop a shared philosophy of collaboration and responsibility for goals

- Identify natural opportunities for the student's meaningful participation
- Focus on educational relevance
- Address accessibility, daily routines, and transitions
