- 3. Educate healthcare providers and future healthcare providers about long-term health and healthcare issues following stroke.
- 4. Educate healthcare providers and future healthcare providers about best practices to help facilitate community integration following TBI
- 5. Educate healthcare providers and future healthcare providers about polypharmacy and how it affects long-term health and healthcare for individuals with neurological conditions.

- 1. Health care professionals who are interested in improving quality of care for persons with SCI, stroke and TBI.
- 2. Educators who train and work with the vast array of professionals who work with SCI, stroke and TBI.
- 3. Persons who have had a SCI, stroke, and TBI and caregivers
- 4. Students in health care professions programs including those in the University of Kentucky Doctor of Physical Therapy program and Eastern Kentucky University Occupational Therapy program.
- 5. Community Partners from a variety of communities.

The previous four conferences were attended by over 200 participants each year and received excellent reviews from attendees. We are expecting 200+ participants again at this year's meeting.
