1) KY Congress on SCI updates (Beth updates)

- Independence Place partnership continues to develop

2) CARAT update

- Bluegrass Technology Center (BTC) went out of business and it is our hope the the UK Human Development Institute will take over at the new Center in the Central KY. The equipment that is currently housed at BTC's warehouse will be dispersed to the other CARAT and KATS sites. Efforts are underway to establish a CARAT center in Lexington.

5) Proposal for new Center in Hazard (Julie, Pat)

- A few funding opportunities coming up
- Collaboration between UK College of Health Sciences, College of Education/Special Education, HDI, College of Engineering.
- Purpose to address disability, need for assistive technology/fabrication and augmentive communication, pain in the context of rehabilitation.
- Offers education and workforce development opportunities. CE for healthcare, work with local school systems, cooperate with current high school students' STEM programs, and partner with Hazard Community and Technical College (e.g., their TeleHealth, Physical Therapy Assistants programs, etc.)
- Service component could include KC3T and billable facility/equipment use for local providers
- Research could cover gait analysis, cancer rehabilitation, frailty prevention, other topics
- Pat would like to see a partnership with Voc/Rehab
- Pat has met with Kentucky Valley Education Cooperative (KVEC)

6) PCORI update (Pat, Beth)

- The first two work groups were very productive caregivers, stroke and TBI were represented. Raw emotion and a clear need for services and support.
