Up to 2 outstanding pre-requisites may be accepted at time of application, however, must be completed by August 2024 (2024-2025 Admission Cycle). Bachelor's degree must be completed by December 2024 (2024-2025 Cycle). Graduate GPAs higher than undergrad GPAs will be substituted if at least 20 hours of graduate credit has been completed from a graduate program curriculum.

Courses must be equivalent to the UK course number. Equivalencies may be checked here.

III. Standardized Exams:

- a. The GRE is no longer required by the UKPA Program.
- b. International applicants are required to take the TOEFL iBT exam. The minimum score requirement is 26 in the reading, writing, speaking, and listening categories.
- IV. Patient Contact: Prior health care experience is required and deemed beneficial to students entering the program. Hours completed may be in the following medical disciplines such as CNA, EMT, CMA, Medical Tech., Scribe, etc. Direct Patient Care is defined as taking vitals, bandaging, patient care procedures, injections, blood pressure checks, bed pan duty, phlebotomy, adult daily living, physical examinations, and any other care in which the person "laid hands on the patient".

Patient Contact and Shadowing hours are documented on the CASPA application.

VI. Shadowing: Although PA shadowing is not a UKPA requirement, it is still strongly recommended to remain a competitive applicant. Applicants are expected to have a clear understanding of the profession to articulate their understanding in the application and interview about the profession. A foundation in primary care PA shadowing is great as well as shadowing other specialties. While shadowing is an excellent means for one to immerse themselves in the profession, there are other ways for exposure such as working clinically around PAs, having a PA mentor, and Pre-PA type courses such as UK's PAS 120 are considered valued experiences.

To be considered a "complete" application you must have submitted and paid as well as CASPA must receive ALL official transcripts and ALL recommendations by July 15th. - XV. <u>UKPA Tuition Information</u>: Please review the tuition spreadsheet linked on our program website. Tuition is subject change each academic year.
- XVI. Program Curriculum: The UKPA Program has a lockstep curriculum that may also be found on the website. The first year and half of the program is the didactic portion, with the first semester kicking off Gross Anatomy, Physiology, Intro. to the Profession, etc. In the following Fall and Spring semesters, students will complete courses in patient and disease management, research methods, pharmacology, procedures, diagnosing, etc. The Graduate Program is a non-thesis research program, in which student groups will conduct a two-semester long research project and poster presentation to faculty. The final year of the curriculum is the clinical rotation portion in which students complete 4-week rotations in the areas of Emergency Medicine, Internal Medicine, Family Medicine, Women's Health, Pediatrics, Surgery, and Psychiatry. Students also may complete three elective rotations. Rotations are completed throughout the state of Kentucky, and three out of state rotations are allowed. The UKPA Program is one of the few programs that offer international clinical rotations sites in Kenya, Swaziland, and England.
- **XVII. Campuses:** The UKPA Program has two campus locations (Morehead & Lexington) which connect using the ITV/Zoom capabilities. (Faculty may be lecturing at either facility.) Any hands-on lab is conducted in person by a faculty member. Applicants are strongly encouraged to visit the campus they are interested in attending.
- **XVIII. Compliance & Behavioral Standards:** Due to the nature of health professions, College of Health Sciences students are held to a high standard of professional behavior & conduct. As healthcare professionals in training, we expect students to be familiar with and adhere to the policies listed on this <u>website</u>. All students are required to have full background checks and a ten-panel drug screening. Additionally, there will be clinical sites that require an updated COVID vaccination. The program and college work with a company called CastleBranch to meet these requirements. Students will be required to submit proof of immunization and other program specific requirements prior to matriculating in January.
